materials

- Fabric
 - one 13" x 3/4" strip
 - scraps, several
- Interfacing, stiff
- Vinyl, clear

make a luggage tag



- **1.** Fold the 13" x ¾" piece of fabric in thirds lengthwise and stitch down the length of it to create the strap.
- **2.** Cut a piece of interfacing to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ ". Fold the strap in half, and sew the raw ends of the strap to one of the short sides of the interfacing to create a loop for hanging. (*Figure 1*)
- **3.** Use the leftover printed fabric scraps (*Figure 2*) from your garment bag to cover the interfacing. When you're satisfied with your arrangement, iron them in place. Repeat on the back of the interfacing and then trim the fabric flush with edges of the interfacing.
- **4.** Machine stitch through all layers in a grid pattern. Finish the edges all around with a zigzag stitch.
- **5.** Cut a piece of clear vinyl to 3" x 4". Center the vinyl on one side of the tag, and stitch around 3 sides of the vinyl, leaving an opening for a business card (See opening image).
